Seeks City Annexation of Perimeter Industries

Committee. Plans Plea To County

Wants Tracts in Four Townships in Municipality

Petitions calling for annexation of about 2.5 square miles of land contiguous to Grand Rapids will be filed, probably July 20, with the county board of supervisors, officials of the Citizens Community for Metropolitan Unification announced Thursday.

Involved, besides the alreadyannounced attempt to annex a portion of the Knollcrest region north and east of Burton st. and Breton rd., in Paris township, SE, are four industrially zoned parcels in Walker, Grand Rapids and Wyoming townships, all including major industries. 50 Work for Merger.

Announcement of the formation of CCMU was made by Albert R. Dilley and Charles M Wiersma, co-chairmen of the committee which includes also Richard DeBoer, Valjean Goethal and Russell Jones.

Dilley and Wiersma said their committee has about 50 other persons, residents of both the city and suburban areas, working toward the unification pro-


